

A base word is a word that has meaning by itself.

Example: portrait = a painting, drawing, photograph, or engraving of a person

You can change the meaning of a base word by adding letters to the beginning or end of it.

Example: The word *considered* in the passage below has an *-ed* ending. Take away the ending, and you have the base word *consider*.

Marking Note: Only underline a base word when it has added letters to its beginning or end.



A prefix is a group of letters attached to the beginning of a base word to change its meaning.


Example: usual = (adjective) common, used often; *She followed her* usual *route to the park*. unusual = (adjective) uncommon, rare; *She took an* unusual *route to the park* and almost got lost.

The prefix un- means not. It gives negative or opposite force to the base word it's attached to.

Add *un-* to the beginning of each base word, then match your new word to its definition.





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
